

HOUSE FLOOR AMENDMENT EXPLANATION



Bill Number: **HB 2686**

Bliss Floor Amendment

-
1. Requires health profession regulatory boards to limit an investigation of a complaint to those investigative subjects and actions that are relevant and material to the issues raised in the complaint that would reasonably be taken to investigate the issue in the complaint.
 2. Clarifies that limiting an investigation of a complaint to the subjects and actions that are relevant to the issues raised in the complaint does not prohibit a health profession regulatory board from investigating any issue or evidence of unprofessional conduct that is discovered or brought to attention during the investigation of the original complaint.
 3. Removes the provision that prohibits a health profession regulatory board from making an administrative dismissal or nondisciplinary remedial act publicly available or reporting any such action to the National Practitioner Data Bank, consistent with federal law.
 4. Removes the provision that prohibits a health profession regulatory board from stating that there are nondisciplinary remedial actions or dismissed actions available for review.
 5. Makes technical and conforming changes.
