## FLOOR AMENDMENT EXPLANATION

• Specifies that an *implement of husbandry* includes an implement or vehicle that is autonomous or uses an automated driving system or that is self-propelled, whether operated manually, equipped with an automated system that is not in use or equipped with an automated system that is in use.

1 The bill as proposed to be amended is reprinted as follows:

Section 1. Section 28-101, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to  $3\ \text{read}$ :

28-101. Definitions

In this title, unless the context otherwise requires:

- 6 1. "Alcohol" means any substance containing any form of alcohol, 7 including ethanol, methanol, propynol and isopropynol.
- 8 2. "Alcohol concentration" if expressed as a percentage means 9 either:
- 10 (a) The number of grams of alcohol per one hundred milliliters of 11 blood.
- 12 (b) The number of grams of alcohol per two hundred ten liters of 13 breath.
- 3. "All-terrain vehicle" means either of the following:
  - (a) A motor vehicle that satisfies all of the following:
- 16 (i) Is designed primarily for recreational nonhighway all-terrain 17 travel.
- 18 (ii) Is fifty or fewer inches in width.
- 19 (iii) Has an unladen weight of one thousand two hundred pounds or 20 less.
- 21 (iv) Travels on three or more nonhighway tires.
  - (v) Is operated on a public highway.
- 23 (b) A recreational off-highway vehicle that satisfies all of the 24 following:
- 25 (i) Is designed primarily for recreational nonhighway all-terrain 26 travel.
- (ii) Is eighty or fewer inches in width.
- 28 (iii) Has an unladen weight of two thousand five hundred pounds or 29 less.

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- (iv) Travels on four or more nonhighway tires.
  - (v) Has a steering wheel for steering control.
- 3 (vi) Has a rollover protective structure.
  - (vii) Has an occupant retention system.
  - 4. "Authorized emergency vehicle" means any of the following:
  - (a) A fire department vehicle.
  - (b) A police vehicle.
- 8 (c) An ambulance or emergency vehicle of a municipal department or 9 public service corporation that is designated or authorized by the 10 department or a local authority.
- 11 (d) Any other ambulance, fire truck or rescue vehicle that is 12 authorized by the department in its sole discretion and that meets 13 liability insurance requirements prescribed by the department.
- 5. "Autocycle" means a three-wheeled motorcycle on which the driver and passengers ride in a fully or partially enclosed seating area that is equipped with a roll cage, safety belts for each occupant and antilock brakes and that is designed to be controlled with a steering wheel and pedals.
- 19 6. "Automated driving system" means the hardware and software that 20 are collectively capable of performing the entire dynamic driving task on 21 a sustained basis, regardless of whether it is limited to a specific 22 operational design domain.
- 7. "Automotive recycler" means a person that is engaged in the 24 business of buying or acquiring a motor vehicle solely for the purpose of 25 dismantling, selling or otherwise disposing of the parts or accessories 26 and that removes parts for resale from six or more vehicles in a calendar 27 year.
- 8. "Autonomous vehicle" means a motor vehicle that is equipped with an automated driving system.
- 9. "Aviation fuel" means all flammable liquids composed of a 31 mixture of selected hydrocarbons expressly manufactured and blended for 32 the purpose of effectively and efficiently operating an internal 33 combustion engine for use in an aircraft but does not include fuel for jet 34 or turbine powered aircraft.
- 35 10. "Bicycle" means a device, including a racing wheelchair, that 36 is propelled by human power and on which a person may ride and that has 37 either:
- 38 (a) Two tandem wheels, either of which is more than sixteen inches 39 in diameter.
- 40 (b) Three wheels in contact with the ground, any of which is more 41 than sixteen inches in diameter.
  - 11. "Board" means the transportation board.
- 43 12. "Bus" means a motor vehicle designed for carrying sixteen or 44 more passengers, including the driver.
- 45 13. "Business district" means the territory contiguous to and 46 including a highway if there are buildings in use for business or 47 industrial purposes within any six hundred feet along the highway, 48 including hotels, banks or office buildings, railroad stations and public

1 buildings that occupy at least three hundred feet of frontage on one side 2 or three hundred feet collectively on both sides of the highway.

- 3 14. "Certificate of ownership" means a paper or an electronic 4 record that is issued in another state or a foreign jurisdiction and that 5 indicates ownership of a vehicle.
- 6 15. "Certificate of title" means a paper document or an electronic 7 record that is issued by the department and that indicates ownership of a 8 vehicle.
- 9 16. "Combination of vehicles" means a truck or truck tractor and 10 semitrailer and any trailer that it tows but does not include a forklift 11 designed for the purpose of loading or unloading the truck, trailer or 12 semitrailer.
- 17. "Controlled substance" means a substance so classified under 14 section 102(6) of the controlled substances act (21 United States Code 15 section 802(6)) and includes all substances listed in schedules I through 16 V of 21 Code of Federal Regulations part 1308.
  - 18. "Conviction" means:

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- 18 (a) An unvacated adjudication of guilt or a determination that a 19 person violated or failed to comply with the law in a court of original 20 jurisdiction or by an authorized administrative tribunal.
- 21 (b) An unvacated forfeiture of bail or collateral deposited to 22 secure the person's appearance in court.
  - (c) A plea of guilty or no contest accepted by the court.
  - (d) The payment of a fine or court costs.
- 25 19. "County highway" means a public road that is constructed and 26 maintained by a county.
- 27 20. "Dealer" means a person who is engaged in the business of 28 buying, selling or exchanging motor vehicles, trailers or semitrailers and 29 who has an established place of business and has paid fees pursuant to 30 section 28-4302.
- 31 21. "Department" means the department of transportation acting 32 directly or through its duly authorized officers and agents.
- 33 22. "Digital network or software application" has the same meaning 34 prescribed in section 28-9551.
- 35 23. "Director" means the director of the department of 36 transportation.
- 37 24. "Drive" means to operate or be in actual physical control of a 38 motor vehicle.
- 39 25. "Driver" means a person who drives or is in actual physical 40 control of a vehicle.
- 41 26. "Driver license" means a license that is issued by a state to 42 an individual and that authorizes the individual to drive a motor vehicle.
  - 27. "Dynamic driving task":
- 44 (a) Means all of the real-time operational and tactical functions 45 required to operate a vehicle in on-road traffic.
  - (b) Includes:
  - (i) Lateral vehicle motion control by steering.
- 48 (ii) Longitudinal motion control by acceleration and deceleration.

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- 1 (iii) Monitoring the driving environment by object and event 2 detection, recognition, classification and response preparation.
  - (iv) Object and event response execution.
  - (v) Maneuver planning.
  - (vi) Enhancing conspicuity by lighting, signaling and gesturing.
- 6 (c) Does not include strategic functions such as trip scheduling 7 and selecting destinations and waypoints.
- 8 28. "Electric bicycle" means a bicycle or tricycle that is equipped 9 with fully operable pedals and an electric motor of less than seven 10 hundred fifty watts and that meets the requirements of one of the 11 following classes:
- 12 (a) "Class 1 electric bicycle" means a bicycle or tricycle that is 13 equipped with an electric motor that provides assistance only when the 14 rider is pedaling and that ceases to provide assistance when the bicycle 15 or tricycle reaches the speed of twenty miles per hour.
- 16 (b) "Class 2 electric bicycle" means a bicycle or tricycle that is 17 equipped with an electric motor that may be used exclusively to propel the 18 bicycle or tricycle and that is not capable of providing assistance when 19 the bicycle or tricycle reaches the speed of twenty miles per hour.
- 20 (c) "Class 3 electric bicycle" means a bicycle or tricycle that is 21 equipped with an electric motor that provides assistance only when the 22 rider is pedaling and that ceases to provide assistance when the bicycle 23 or tricycle reaches the speed of twenty-eight miles per hour.
  - 29. "Electric miniature scooter" means a device that:
  - (a) Weighs less than thirty pounds.
  - (b) Has two or three wheels.
- 27 (c) Has handlebars.
  - (d) Has a floorboard on which a person may stand while riding.
  - (e) Is powered by an electric motor or human power, or both.
- 30 (f) Has a maximum speed that does not exceed ten miles per hour, 31 with or without human propulsion, on a paved level surface.
- 30. "Electric personal assistive mobility device" means a self-balancing device with one wheel or two nontandem wheels and an 4 electric propulsion system that limits the maximum speed of the device to fifteen miles per hour or less and that is designed to transport only one 36 person.
  - 31. "Electric standup scooter":
  - (a) Means a device that:
  - (i) Weighs less than seventy-five pounds.
- 40 (ii) Has two or three wheels.
  - (iii) Has handlebars.
    - (iv) Has a floorboard on which a person may stand while riding.
  - (v) Is powered by an electric motor or human power, or both.
- (vi) Has a maximum speed that does not exceed twenty miles per 45 hour, with or without human propulsion, on a paved level surface.
  - (b) Does not include an electric miniature scooter.
- 47 32. "Evidence" includes both of the following:

- 1 (a) A display on a wireless communication device of a 2 department-generated driver license, nonoperating identification license, 3 vehicle registration card or other official record of the department that 4 is presented to a law enforcement officer or in a court or an 5 administrative proceeding.
- 6 (b) An electronic or digital license plate authorized pursuant to 7 section 28-364.
- 8 33. "Farm" means any lands primarily used for agriculture 9 production.
- 10 34. "Farm tractor" means a motor vehicle designed and used 11 primarily as a farm implement for drawing implements of husbandry.
- 35. "Foreign vehicle" means a motor vehicle, trailer or semitrailer that is brought into this state other than in the ordinary course of the business by or through a manufacturer or dealer and that has not been to registered in this state.
- 36. "Fully autonomous vehicle" means an autonomous vehicle that is 17 equipped with an automated driving system designed to function as a level 18 four or five system under SAE J3016 and that may be designed to function 19 either:
  - (a) Solely by use of the automated driving system.
- 21 (b) By a human driver when the automated driving system is not 22 engaged.
- 37. "Golf cart" means a motor vehicle that has not less than three 24 wheels in contact with the ground, that has an unladen weight of less than 25 one thousand eight hundred pounds, that is designed to be and is operated 26 at not more than twenty-five miles per hour and that is designed to carry 27 not more than four persons including the driver.
- 38. "Hazardous material" means a material, and its mixtures or solutions, that the United States department of transportation determines under 49 Code of Federal Regulations is, or any quantity of a material listed as a select agent or toxin under 42 Code of Federal Regulations part 73 that is, capable of posing an unreasonable risk to health, safety and property if transported in commerce and that is required to be placarded or marked as required by the department's safety rules prescribed pursuant to chapter 14 of this title.
- 36 39. "Human driver" means a natural person in the vehicle who 37 performs in real time all or part of the dynamic driving task or who 38 achieves a minimal risk condition for the vehicle.
- 40. "Implement of husbandry" means a vehicle that is designed 40 primarily for agricultural purposes and that is used exclusively in the 41 conduct of agricultural operations, including an implement or vehicle 42 whether THAT USES AN AUTOMATED DRIVING SYSTEM OR THAT IS AUTONOMOUS OR 43 THAT IS self-propelled or otherwise [, WHETHER OPERATED MANUALLY, EQUIPPED 44 WITH AN AUTOMATED DRIVING SYSTEM THAT IS NOT IN USE OR EQUIPPED WITH AN 45 AUTOMATED DRIVING SYSTEM THAT IS IN USE,] AND that meets both of the 46 following conditions:
- 47 (a) Is used solely for agricultural purposes including the 48 preparation or harvesting of cotton, alfalfa, grains, SPECIALTY CROPS and

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1 other farm crops. FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SUBDIVISION, "SPECIALTY CROPS" 2 INCLUDES FRUITS, VEGETABLES, TREE NUTS, DRIED FRUITS AND HORTICULTURE AND 3 NURSERY CROPS, INCLUDING FLORICULTURE.

- 4 (b) Is only incidentally operated or moved on a highway whether as 5 a trailer OR AN AUTONOMOUS VEHICLE or A self-propelled unit. For the 6 purposes of this subdivision, "incidentally operated or moved on a 7 highway" means travel between a farm and another part of the same farm, 8 from one farm to another farm or between a farm and a place of repair, 9 supply or storage.
- 10 41. "Limousine" means a motor vehicle providing prearranged ground 11 transportation service for an individual passenger, or a group of 12 passengers, that is arranged in advance or is operated on a regular route 13 or between specified points and includes ground transportation under a 14 contract or agreement for services that includes a fixed rate or time and 15 is provided in a motor vehicle with a seating capacity not exceeding 16 fifteen passengers including the driver.
  - 42. "Livery vehicle" means a motor vehicle that:
- 18 (a) Has a seating capacity not exceeding fifteen passengers 19 including the driver.
- 20 (b) Provides passenger services for a fare determined by a flat 21 rate or flat hourly rate between geographic zones or within a geographic 22 area.
  - (c) Is available for hire on an exclusive or shared ride basis.
  - (d) May do any of the following:
  - (i) Operate on a regular route or between specified places.
- (ii) Offer prearranged ground transportation service as defined in 27 section 28-141.
- 28 (iii) Offer on demand ground transportation service pursuant to a 29 contract with a public airport, licensed business entity or organization.
- 30 43. "Local authority" means any county, municipal or other local 31 board or body exercising jurisdiction over highways under the constitution 32 and laws of this state.
- 33 44. "Manufacturer" means a person engaged in the business of 34 manufacturing motor vehicles, trailers or semitrailers.
  - 45. "Minimal risk condition":
- 36 (a) Means a condition to which a human driver or an automated 37 driving system may bring a vehicle in order to reduce the risk of a crash 38 when a given trip cannot or should not be completed.
  - (b) Includes bringing the vehicle to a complete stop.
- 46. "Moped" means a bicycle, not including an electric bicycle, an 41 electric miniature scooter or an electric standup scooter, that is 42 equipped with a helper motor if the vehicle has a maximum piston 43 displacement of fifty cubic centimeters or less, a brake horsepower of one 44 and one-half or less and a maximum speed of twenty-five miles per hour or 45 less on a flat surface with less than a one percent grade.
- 47. "Motorcycle" means a motor vehicle that has a seat or saddle 47 for the use of the rider and that is designed to travel on not more than 48 three wheels in contact with the ground but excludes a tractor, an

1 electric bicycle, an electric miniature scooter, an electric standup 2 scooter and a moped.

- 48. "Motor driven cycle" means a motorcycle, including every motor scooter, with a motor that produces not more than five horsepower but does not include an electric bicycle, an electric miniature scooter or an electric standup scooter.
- 7 49. "Motorized quadricycle" means a self-propelled motor vehicle to 8 which all of the following apply:
- 9 (a) The vehicle is self-propelled by an emission-free electric 10 motor and may include pedals operated by the passengers.
- 11 (b) The vehicle has at least four wheels in contact with the 12 ground.
- 13 (c) The vehicle seats at least eight passengers, including the 14 driver.
- 15 (d) The vehicle is operable on a flat surface using solely the 16 electric motor without assistance from the pedals or passengers.
- 17 (e) The vehicle is a commercial motor vehicle as defined in section  $18\ 28-5201$ .
- 19 (f) The vehicle is a limousine operating under a vehicle for hire 20 company permit issued pursuant to section 28-9503.
- 21 (g) The vehicle is manufactured by a motor vehicle manufacturer 22 that is licensed pursuant to chapter 10 of this title.
- (h) The vehicle complies with the definition and standards for (24) low-speed vehicles set forth in (49) Code of Federal Regulations sections (25) (57) (37)
  - 50. "Motor vehicle":
  - (a) Means either:

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- (i) A self-propelled vehicle.
- 29 (ii) For the purposes of the laws relating to the imposition of a 30 tax on motor vehicle fuel, a vehicle that is operated on the highways of 31 this state and that is propelled by the use of motor vehicle fuel.
- 32 (b) Does not include a scrap vehicle, a personal delivery device, a 33 personal mobile cargo carrying device, a motorized wheelchair, an electric 34 personal assistive mobility device, an electric bicycle, an electric 35 miniature scooter, an electric standup scooter or a motorized skateboard. 36 For the purposes of this subdivision:
- 37 (i) "Motorized skateboard" means a self-propelled device that does 38 not have handlebars and that has a motor, a deck on which a person may 39 ride and at least two tandem wheels in contact with the ground.
- 40 (ii) "Motorized wheelchair" means a self-propelled wheelchair that 41 is used by a person for mobility.
- 51. "Motor vehicle fuel" includes all products that are commonly or commercially known or sold as gasoline, including casinghead gasoline, at natural gasoline and all flammable liquids, and that are composed of a mixture of selected hydrocarbons expressly manufactured and blended for the purpose of effectively and efficiently operating internal combustion engines. Motor vehicle fuel does not include inflammable liquids that are specifically manufactured for racing motor vehicles and that are

1 distributed for and used by racing motor vehicles at a racetrack, use fuel 2 as defined in section 28-5601, aviation fuel, fuel for jet or turbine 3 powered aircraft or the mixture created at the interface of two different 4 substances being transported through a pipeline, commonly known as 5 transmix.

- 52. "Neighborhood electric shuttle":
- 7 (a) Means a self-propelled electrically powered motor vehicle to 8 which all of the following apply:
  - (i) The vehicle is emission free.
- 10 (ii) The vehicle has at least four wheels in contact with the 11 ground.
- 12 (iii) The vehicle is capable of transporting at least eight 13 passengers, including the driver.
- 14 (iv) The vehicle is a commercial motor vehicle as defined in 15 section 28-5201.
- 16 (v) The vehicle is a vehicle for hire as defined in section 28-9501 17 and operates under a vehicle for hire company permit issued pursuant to 18 section 28-9503.
- 19 (vi) The vehicle complies with the definition and standards for 20 low-speed vehicles set forth in 49 Code of Federal Regulations sections 21 571.3(b) and 571.500, respectively.
- 22 (b) Includes a vehicle that meets the standards prescribed in 23 subdivision (a) of this paragraph and that has been modified after market 24 and not by the manufacturer to transport up to fifteen passengers, 25 including the driver.
- 26 53. "Neighborhood electric vehicle" means a self-propelled 27 electrically powered motor vehicle to which all of the following apply:
  - (a) The vehicle is emission free.
- 29 (b) The vehicle has at least four wheels in contact with the 30 ground.
- 31 (c) The vehicle complies with the definition and standards for 32 low-speed vehicles, unless excepted or exempted under federal law, set 33 forth in 49 Code of Federal Regulations sections 571.3(b) and 571.500, 34 respectively.
- 35 54. "Neighborhood occupantless electric vehicle" means a 36 neighborhood electric vehicle that is not designed, intended or marketed 37 for human occupancy.
- 38 55. "Nonresident" means a person who is not a resident of this 39 state as defined in section 28-2001.
- 40 56. "Off-road recreational motor vehicle" means a motor vehicle 41 that is designed primarily for recreational nonhighway all-terrain travel 42 and that is not operated on a public highway. Off-road recreational motor 43 vehicle does not mean a motor vehicle used for construction, building 44 trade, mining or agricultural purposes.

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- 57. "Operational design domain":
- 2 (a) Means operating conditions under which a given automated 3 driving system is specifically designed to function.
- 4 (b) Includes roadway types, speed range, environmental conditions, 5 such as weather or time of day, and other domain constraints.
- 58. "Operator" means a person who drives a motor vehicle on a highway, who is in actual physical control of a motor vehicle on a highway 8 or who is exercising control over or steering a vehicle being towed by a 9 motor vehicle.
  - 59. "Owner" means:
  - (a) A person who holds the legal title of a vehicle.
- 12 (b) If a vehicle is the subject of an agreement for the conditional 13 sale or lease with the right of purchase on performance of the conditions 14 stated in the agreement and with an immediate right of possession vested 15 in the conditional vendee or lessee, the conditional vendee or lessee.
- 16 (c) If a mortgagor of a vehicle is entitled to possession of the 17 vehicle, the mortgagor.
- 18 60. "Pedestrian" means any person afoot. A person who uses an 19 electric personal assistive mobility device or a manual or motorized 20 wheelchair is considered a pedestrian unless the manual wheelchair 21 qualifies as a bicycle. For the purposes of this paragraph, "motorized 22 wheelchair" means a self-propelled wheelchair that is used by a person for 23 mobility.
  - 61. "Personal delivery device":
  - (a) Means a device that is both of the following:
- 26 (i) Manufactured for transporting cargo and goods in an area 27 described in section 28–1225.
- 28 (ii) Equipped with automated driving technology, including software 29 and hardware, that enables the operation of the device with the remote 30 support and supervision of a human.
  - (b) Does not include a personal mobile cargo carrying device.
- 32 62. "Personal mobile cargo carrying device" means an electronically 33 powered device that:
- 34 (a) Is operated primarily on sidewalks and within crosswalks and 35 that is designed to transport property.
  - (b) Weighs less than eighty pounds, excluding cargo.
  - (c) Operates at a maximum speed of twelve miles per hour.
- 38 (d) Is equipped with technology to transport personal property with 39 the active monitoring of a property owner and that is primarily designed 40 to remain within twenty-five feet of the property owner.
- 41 (e) Is equipped with a braking system that when active or engaged 42 enables the personal mobile cargo carrying device to come to a controlled 43 stop.

- 1 63. "Power sweeper" means an implement, with or without motive 2 power, that is only incidentally operated or moved on a street or highway 3 and that is designed for the removal of debris, dirt, gravel, litter or 4 sand whether by broom, vacuum or regenerative air system from asphaltic 5 concrete or cement concrete surfaces, including parking lots, highways, 6 streets and warehouses, and a vehicle on which the implement is 7 permanently mounted.
- 8 64. "Public transit" means the transportation of passengers on 9 scheduled routes by means of a conveyance on an individual passenger 10 fare-paying basis excluding transportation by a sightseeing bus, school 11 bus or taxi or a vehicle not operated on a scheduled route basis.
- 12 65. "Reconstructed vehicle" means a vehicle that has been assembled 13 or constructed largely by means of essential parts, new or used, derived 14 from vehicles or makes of vehicles of various names, models and types or 15 that, if originally otherwise constructed, has been materially altered by 16 the removal of essential parts or by the addition or substitution of 17 essential parts, new or used, derived from other vehicles or makes of 18 vehicles. For the purposes of this paragraph, "essential parts" means 19 integral and body parts, the removal, alteration or substitution of which 20 will tend to conceal the identity or substantially alter the appearance of 21 the vehicle.
- 22 66. "Residence district" means the territory contiguous to and 23 including a highway not comprising a business district if the property on 24 the highway for a distance of three hundred feet or more is in the main 25 improved with residences or residences and buildings in use for business.
- 26 67. "Right-of-way" when used within the context of the regulation 27 of the movement of traffic on a highway means the privilege of the 28 immediate use of the highway. Right-of-way when used within the context 29 of the real property on which transportation facilities and appurtenances 30 to the facilities are constructed or maintained means the lands or 31 interest in lands within the right-of-way boundaries.
- 32 68. "SAE J3016" means surface transportation recommended practice 33 J3016 taxonomy and definitions for terms related to driving automation 34 systems for on-road motor vehicles published by SAE international in June 35 2018.
- 36 69. "School bus" means a motor vehicle that is designed for 37 carrying more than ten passengers and that is either:
- 38 (a) Owned by any public or governmental agency or other institution 39 and operated for the transportation of children to or from home or school 40 on a regularly scheduled basis.
- 41 (b) Privately owned and operated for compensation for the 42 transportation of children to or from home or school on a regularly 43 scheduled basis.
- 70. "Scrap metal dealer" has the same meaning prescribed in section 45 44-1641.
- 46 71. "Scrap vehicle" has the same meaning prescribed in section 47 44-1641.

- 72. "Semitrailer" means a vehicle that is with or without motive power, other than a pole trailer or single-axle tow dolly, that is designed for carrying persons or property and for being drawn by a motor vehicle and that is constructed so that some part of its weight and that of its load rests on or is carried by another vehicle. For the purposes of this paragraph, "pole trailer" has the same meaning prescribed in section 28-601.
- 8 73. "Single-axle tow dolly" means a nonvehicle device that is drawn 9 by a motor vehicle, that is designed and used exclusively to transport 10 another motor vehicle and on which the front or rear wheels of the drawn 11 motor vehicle are mounted on the tow dolly while the other wheels of the 12 drawn motor vehicle remain in contact with the ground.
- 13 74. "State" means a state of the United States and the District of 14 Columbia.
- 75. "State highway" means a state route or portion of a state route that is accepted and designated by the board as a state highway and that is maintained by the state.
- 18 76. "State route" means a right-of-way whether actually used as a 19 highway or not that is designated by the board as a location for the 20 construction of a state highway.
- 77. "Street" or "highway" means the entire width between the 22 boundary lines of every way if a part of the way is open to the use of the 23 public for purposes of vehicular travel.
- 78. "Taxi" means a motor vehicle that has a seating capacity not exceeding fifteen passengers, including the driver, that provides passenger services and that:
- 27 (a) Does not primarily operate on a regular route or between 28 specified places.
- 29 (b) Offers local transportation for a fare determined on the basis 30 of the distance traveled or prearranged ground transportation service as 31 defined in section 28-141 for a predetermined fare.
- 32 79. "Title transfer form" means a paper or an electronic form that 33 is prescribed by the department for the purpose of transferring a 34 certificate of title from one owner to another owner.
- 35 80. "Traffic survival school" means a school that is licensed 36 pursuant to chapter 8, article 7.1 of this title and that offers 37 educational sessions that are designed to improve the safety and habits of 38 drivers and that are approved by the department.
- 39 81. "Trailer" means a vehicle that is with or without motive power, 40 other than a pole trailer or single-axle tow dolly, that is designed for 41 carrying persons or property and for being drawn by a motor vehicle and 42 that is constructed so that no part of its weight rests on the towing 43 vehicle. A semitrailer equipped with an auxiliary front axle commonly 44 known as a dolly is deemed to be a trailer. For the purposes of this 45 paragraph, "pole trailer" has the same meaning prescribed in section 46 28-601.
- 47 82. "Transportation network company" has the same meaning 48 prescribed in section 28-9551.

- 1 83. "Transportation network company vehicle" has the same meaning 2 prescribed in section 28-9551.
- 3 84. "Transportation network service" has the same meaning 4 prescribed in section 28-9551.
- 5 85. "Truck" means a motor vehicle designed or used primarily for 6 the carrying of property other than the effects of the driver or 7 passengers and includes a motor vehicle to which has been added a box, a 8 platform or other equipment for such carrying.
- 9 86. "Truck tractor" means a motor vehicle that is designed and used 10 primarily for drawing other vehicles and that is not constructed to carry 11 a load other than a part of the weight of the vehicle and load drawn.
- 12 87. "Vehicle":

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- 13 (a) Means a device in, on or by which a person or property is or 14 may be transported or drawn on a public highway.
  - (b) Does not include:
- 16 (i) Electric bicycles, electric miniature scooters, electric 17 standup scooters and devices moved by human power.
  - (ii) Devices used exclusively on stationary rails or tracks.
- 19 (iii) Personal delivery devices.
- 20 (iv) Scrap vehicles.
- 21 (v) Personal mobile cargo carrying devices.
- 22 88. "Vehicle transporter" means either:
- 23 (a) A truck tractor capable of carrying a load and drawing a 24 semitrailer.
- (b) A truck tractor with a stinger-steered fifth wheel capable of 26 carrying a load and drawing a semitrailer or a truck tractor with a dolly 27 mounted fifth wheel that is securely fastened to the truck tractor at two 28 or more points and that is capable of carrying a load and drawing a 29 semitrailer.
