2 Section 1. Section 28-851, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to 3 read:

28-851. <u>Railroad crossing; safety</u>

5 A. Except as provided in subsection B of this section, when a 6 person driving a vehicle approaches a railroad grade crossing, the driver 7 of the vehicle shall stop within fifty feet but not less than fifteen feet 8 from the nearest rail of the railroad and may not proceed if any of the 9 following applies:

10 1. A clearly visible electric or mechanical signal device gives 11 warning of the immediate approach of a railroad train OR OTHER ON-TRACK 12 [MAINTENANCE] EQUIPMENT.

13 2. A crossing gate is lowered or a human flagman gives or continues 14 to give a signal of the approach or passage of a railroad train OR OTHER 15 ON-TRACK [MAINTENANCE] EQUIPMENT.

16 3. A railroad train OR OTHER ON-TRACK [MAINTENANCE] EQUIPMENT 17 approaching within approximately one thousand five hundred feet of the 18 highway crossing emits a signal audible from such a distance and the 19 railroad train OR OTHER ON-TRACK [MAINTENANCE] EQUIPMENT is an immediate 20 hazard by reason of its speed or proximity to the crossing.

21 4. An approaching railroad train OR OTHER ON-TRACK [MAINTENANCE] 22 EQUIPMENT is plainly visible and is in hazardous proximity to the 23 crossing.

5. Any other condition exists that makes it unsafe to proceed through the crossing.

B. An operator of a vehicle who suspects a false activation or malfunction of a railroad grade crossing signal device where there is no gate or barrier may proceed through the railroad grade crossing after stopping if all of the following apply:

30 1. The operator of the vehicle has a clear line of sight of at 31 least one mile of the railroad tracks in all directions.

2. There is no evidence of an approaching RAILROAD train OR OTHER 1 2 ON-TRACK [MAINTENANCE] EQUIPMENT. 3. The vehicle may cross over the tracks safely. 3 4 4. If the vehicle is a school bus, the operator complies with 5 written district policy. C. An operator of a vehicle may not make a u-turn or turn the 6 7 vehicle to proceed in the opposite direction on a railroad track or 8 railroad grade crossing. 9 D. A person shall not proceed through, around, over or under a 10 crossing gate or barrier at a railroad crossing while the gate or barrier 11 is closed or is being opened or closed. E. A pedestrian shall not do any of the following: 12 1. Enter or remain within the area between a railroad track and a 13 14 railroad sign or signal if the railroad grade crossing is active. 2. Occupy or remain on a railroad grade crossing when the railroad 15 16 sign or signal is not active except to cross the railroad crossing on a 17 designated walkway. 3. Remain in an area between railroad signs or signals, railroad 18 19 gates or rail crossing arms if the railroad grade crossing is active. Sec. 2. Section 28-853, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to 20 21 read: 22 28-853. Railroad grade crossing; stop required of certain vehicles: exceptions: other requirements 23 24 A. Except as otherwise provided in this article, before crossing at 25 grade any track or tracks of a railroad, the driver of a motor vehicle 26 carrying passengers for hire, of any school bus carrying any school child 27 or of any vehicle carrying or returning after delivery of DELIVERING 28 explosive substances or flammable liquids as a cargo or part of a cargo 29 shall stop the vehicle within fifty feet but not less than fifteen feet 30 from the nearest rail of the railroad, while stopped listen and look in 31 both directions along the track for an approaching train OR OTHER ON-TRACK 32 [<u>MAINTENANCE</u>] EQUIPMENT and for signals indicating the approach of a AN 33 APPROACHING RAILROAD train OR OTHER ON-TRACK [MAINTENANCE] EQUIPMENT and 34 not proceed until the driver can do so safely. After stopping as required 35 by this section SUBSECTION and on proceeding when it is safe to do so, the 36 driver of the vehicle shall cross only in a gear of the vehicle for which 37 there is no need to change gears while traversing the crossing and shall 38 not shift gears while crossing the track or tracks. This subsection does 39 not apply at: 1. A crossing where a police officer or a traffic control signal 40 41 directs traffic to proceed. 42 2. A street railway grade crossing within a business or residence 43 district. 44 B. A driver of a commercial motor vehicle shall not enter a 45 railroad or rail transit crossing unless there is sufficient space on the 46 other side of the railroad or rail transit crossing to accommodate the 47 vehicle being driven.

C. A driver of a commercial motor vehicle shall not enter a 1 2 railroad or rail transit crossing unless there is sufficient undercarriage 3 clearance to cross the intersection without obstructing the through 4 passage of a railway vehicle, including a RAILROAD train or a city transit 5 vehicle. Sec. 3. Section 28-854, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to 6 7 read: 28-854. Railroad grade crossing; moving heavy equipment; 8 9 exception; definition A. A person shall not operate or move any heavy equipment on or 10 11 across a track at a railroad grade crossing unless: 1. Notice of the intended crossing is given to a station agent of 12 13 the railroad. 14 2. Before making the crossing, the person operating or moving the 15 vehicle or **HEAVY** equipment: (a) Stops the vehicle or equipment at least fifteen feet but not 16 17 more than fifty feet from the nearest rail of the railroad. (b) While so stopped, listens and looks in both directions along 18 19 the track for an approaching RAILROAD train OR OTHER ON-TRACK 20 [MAINTENANCE] EQUIPMENT and for signals indicating the approach of a AN 21 APPROACHING RAILROAD train OR OTHER ON-TRACK [MAINTENANCE] EQUIPMENT. 3. Does not proceed until the crossing can be made safely. 22 23 B. A person shall not make a crossing pursuant to SUBSECTION A OF 24 this section when a warning is given by automatic signal, crossing gates 25 or a flagman or otherwise of the immediate approach of a railroad train or 26 car OR OTHER ON-TRACK [MAINTENANCE] EQUIPMENT. If a flagman is provided 27 by the railroad, movement over the crossing shall be under the flagman's 28 direction. 29 C. This section does not apply to the normal movement of farm 30 equipment in the regular course of a farm operation. D. For the purposes of this section, "heavy equipment" means any 31 32 crawler type tractor, steam shovel, derrick, roller or other equipment or 33 structure having a normal operating speed of ten miles per hour or less or 34 a vertical body or load clearance of less than one-half inch per foot of 35 the distance between any two adjacent axles or in any event of less than 36 nine inches measured above the level surface of a roadway. 37 Enroll and engross to conform 38 Amend title to conform CONSUELO HERNANDEZ

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
